
Technology devices (provided by CLS):

Start in August 2023









EU FISHERIES ROADMAP

- ♦ Objective: Support a just digital transition of SSF in the EU by 2030
- Method: Consultative approach with key actors
- Status: Preliminary version published (scan the QR code to access the document)
- Next steps: Comprehensive analysis & synthesis to expand and refine preliminary version









EU Control regulation

- ❖ PECH adopted the provisional agreement 27 June
 - plenary vote by November 2023 (TBC)
- Impacts on small-scale fisheries
 - Vessel tracking and electronic catch reporting for all by 2030, with special system for vessels < 12 meters
 - Traceability (mandatory use of EU CATCH IT system with vessel identifier, catching method and catch area)





- Impacts on recreational fisheries
 - Sale prohibited
 - Mandatory registration by 2030
 - Electronic catch reporting system

Digital transition & the implementation of the Common Fisheries Policy?

- Improved fisheries management
 - Better catch selectivity, avoiding by-catches including sensitive species
 - Enhanced catch recording and reporting
- Trustworthy seafood traceability
 - Improved fisheries' documentation and data collection
 - Better information to consumers
- Incentivise all fisheries towards more selective, low-impact and sustainable practices to improve fish population's replenishment
- **Energy-efficient devices**
 - Solar powered, high battery autonomy
